

The college has Campus Beautification Committee which aims to improving greenery in the college premises. The composition of the committee is as follow:

The district of Gadchiroli is well known for its forests and variety of medicinal plants. The district's medicinal herbs are valuable biological resources that have a strong connection to traditional medicine, culture, and health care. Since ancient times, man has used plants to treat diseases, and some of these traditional medicines are still used today as routine treatments for various problems. Due to rising export demand, locals' depend on herbal flora and their acknowledged faith in ancient Ayurvedic medicine practises will go a long way toward helping them for financial gain and research efforts to produce beneficial results. Hence overharvesting, loss of habitat, increasing urbanization and decrease forest area have been causing irreversible loss of medicinal plant population in the wild habitat, resulting in decline in the volume of raw materials. Plants of medicinal significance such as Hirda, Bhuineem, and Tarota etc. are exported illegally. A significant part of knowledge and traditional is currently being eroded due to modernization. Therefore, it is necessary to hammer young minds to realize the fascinating knowledge and tradition associated with these resources and help them understand the immense potentials local wild medicinal plants possess for the future. Hence our institution established Herbal Garden.

#### It is simple way for students to obtain information about various trees.

Nowadays when Quick Response (QR) codes have become very popular for digital payments everywhere, Mahatma Gandhi Arts, Science and Late N. P. Commerce college, Armori in Gadchiroli District of Maharashtra displaying how the technology may benefit students and help them to get information about a tree. A total 16 plant species were labelled in the college. Students lack the time to read books and to learn about the things around them through books. Hence, the Botany Department has decided to take advantage of the rapid expansion platform of QR code. Students in the college premises scan QR codes posted on trees for information. The QR code provides information about the tree, its scientific name, local name, its uses, native place and morphology of the tree, etc.
