Whereas, The Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 i.e. Maharashtra Act No. VI of 2017 has been made applicable to the university with effect from the 1st March, 2017;

AND

Whereas, Ordinance No. 119 of 2017 was made by the Management council in respect of Examinations leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Arts (B.A.)(Six semester Degree Course) based on Choice Based Credit System in the Faculty of Humanities Ordinance, 2017;

AND

Whereas, the said ordinance No.119 of 2017, is applicable to Bachelor of Arts degree course from the Academic year 2017-2018;

AND

Whereas, the scheme of Examinations provided under the said ordinance No.119 of 2017 in respect of the subject Indian Music' is not suitable to the course structute based on Choice Based Credit System of the said subject;

AND

Whereas, the meeting of the Board of studies in Music was held on 18/08/2017 for preparing course structure and the scheme of Examinations for the subject Indian Music appointed for Bachelor of Arts(B.A.)degree course;

AND

Whereas, the Board of studies in Music has submitted the course and examinations scheme with Choice Based Credit System for Indian Music subject Appointed for Bachelor of Arts degree course(B.A.);

AND

Whereas, the course and sheme of Examinations submitted and recommended by the Board of studies in Music has been accepted by the Vice-Chancellor under provision of section 12(7) of the Act, on behalf of the Faculty of Humanities and the Academic Council on 16 / 09 /2017;

AND

Whereas, the scheme of examinations for the subject Indian Music at the Bachelor of Arts degree level was required to be included in the existing ordinance No. 119 of 2017 by way of making amendment in the said Ordinance;

AND

Whereas, the Matter is required to be regulated by an ordinance as provided under the Act;

AND

Whereas, amending of an Ordinance No. 119 of 2017 is a time consuming process;

AND

Whereas, there is an emergency for including the scheme of examinations, relating to Indian Music, in Ordinance No. 119 of 2017 which is applicable from the Academic Session 2017-2018:

Now, therefore, I,Dr. N.V. Kalyankar, Vice-Chancellor, Gondwana University, Gadchiroli in exercise of the powers conferred upon me under provision of section 12(8) of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act,2016 do hereby issue following Directions to amend Ordinance No. 119 of 2017:-

1. This Direction shall be called "Examinations leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Arts (B.A.)(Six semester degree course) based on the choice based credit system in the faculty of Humanities, (Amendment) Direction, 2017."

- 2. This Direction shall come into force with effect from the date of its issuance.
- 3. In Ordinance No. 119 Of 2017 in respect of Examinations leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Arts (B.A.)(Six semester Degree Course) based on Choice Based Credit System in the faculty of Humanities ordinance 2017(hereinafter reffered to as the main Ordinance)
 - 1) Serial No. '1' appearing after para 3,8) with a title "B.A.(Bachelor of Arts) degree under the Faculty of Humanities" be substituted by serial No. "4".
 - 2) Serial No. '2' appearing after para 3, 8) with a title "Scheme for teaching & Examinations" be substituted by Serial No. "5".
- **4.** After clause (xiv) of above renumbered para '5' and before clause (xv) of the said renumbered para '5' of the main ordinance, following proviso be added.

"Provided that course and examinations scheme with choice based credit system for Indian Music (Core discipline specific course) shall be as provided under Appendix-VI appended with this Direction."

EXAMINATIONS LEADING TO THE DEGREE OF (विज्ञान स्नातक) BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (B.SC.) (SIX SEMESTER DEGREE COURSE) BASED ON CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) IN THE FACULTY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY DIRECTION, 2017.

(Issued under Provision of Section 12(8) of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016.)

Whereas, The Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 has come into force with effect from 1st March 2017 (Maharashtra Act No. VI of 2017) (hereinafter referred to as the Act);

AND

Whereas, the above mentioned Act is applicable to the Gondwana University, Gadchiroli from 1st March, 2017;

AND

Whereas, the chairman, U.G.C. New Delhi has directed the Vice-Chancellor of the university to initiate steps for successful implementation of the choice based credit system(CBCS) from the Academic Session 2015-16 vide letter D.O.No.F-1-1/2015(CM) dated 8/01/2015;

AND

Whereas, the U.G.C. has formulated and issued guidelines on adoption of choice based credit system in all the universities;

AND

Whereas, the Vice-Chancellor has directed, on the basis of the resolution of the authorities of the university, to formulate and introduce choice based

credit system at U.G. and P.G. level programme in all the faculties in the university;

AND

Whereas, the matter to introduce choice based credit system is required to be regulated by an ordinance to be made in this behalf;

AND

Whereas, no Ordinance is in existence in the university for introducing choice based credit system in the faculty of Science and Technology;

AND

Whereas, making of an Ordinance for introducing choice based credit system in the faculty of Science and Technology is a time consuming process;

AND

Whereas, the choice based credit system is to be introduced at the Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) Degree level in the faculty of Science and Technology from the Academic year 2017-18.

Now, therefore, I, Dr. N.V. Kalyankar, Vice-Chancellor, Gondwana University, Gadchiroli in exercise of the powers vested in me under provision of section 12 (8) of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act,2016 do hereby issue following Directions:-

- 1. This Direction shall be called "Examinations leading to the Degree of (ৰিন্নান ধনানক) Bachelor of Science (B.SC.) (Six Semester Degree Course) based on Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in the Faculty of Science and Technology Direction, 2017.
- 2. This Direction shall come into force with effect from the date of its issuance.



3. Need for academic reforms in Indian Higher Education:

a) In the knowledge based society, quality of higher education is of prime importance. There are many concerns about the quality of education imported to the learners and its overall impact on the development of the nation. In the existing system lack of flexibility in the curriculum and absence of comprehensive national framework for facilitating mutual give & take of the academic programs offered by different higher education providers is the main lacuna. It is the need of time to give serious re-look at the existing systems & introduce reforms wherever possible.

b) Recommendations of National Regulating authority:

The University Grants commission(UGC)NAAC, Distance Education council(DEC) & National knowledge commission(NKC) have suggested the recommendations to improve upon the quality & effectiveness of higher education in the country. It is the need to develop a choice Based credit sytem(CBCS) in tune with global trends & adaption of grading system for learner performance. Today, there is a need for fully convertible credit based system, acceptable to other univerties.

All the major higher education providers across the globe are operating the systems of credits.

- c) The concept of CBCS in brief: CBCS essentially redefines the curriculum into smaller measurable entities of modules/units with the hours required for studying/learning. The mechanism is to be developed to combine these modules in different ways so as to quality for a given Programme. The learner is at the center of all academic transactions.
- d) Need for Introduction of CBCS: The features highlighted by UGC are: Enhanced learning opportunities, ability to match learners' scholastic needs and aspirations, inter university transferability of learners (after completion of semester) allows part completion of an academic Programme in the Institution of enrolment & part completion in other (recognized) institution. This scheme provides improvement in educational quality and excellence, flexibility for working learners to complete the programme over an extended period of time, standardization and compatibility of educational programmes across the country.

e) Advantages of Credit System:

- Shift in focus from teacher-centric to student- centric education, since the workload is calculated on the time spent in learning, and not in teaching.
- Helps to record work and document learner workload.
- Helps self-paced learning.
- Allows more flexibility to the learners to choose the programs.
- Respects "Learner Autonomy". Allows learns to choose according to their own learning needs, interests and aptitudes.

State N.P. Soleting State

- Makes education more broad-based. One can take credits by combing unique combinations.
- Facilitates learner mobility. Offers the opportunity to sliding at different times and in different institutions. Credits earned at one institution can be transferred to another.
- Is beneficial for achieving more transparency and compatibility between different educational structures.
- A credit system can facilitate recognition procedures as well as access to higher education for non-traditional leaners.
 - f) Scientific approach to implementation:

To implement the credit system, a scientific approach has to be adopted for the benefit of the learner.

- 4. In this Direction, unless the context otherwise requires:-
 - Academic Year: Two consecutive (one odd + one even) semester constitutes one Academic year.
 - 2) Choice Based Credit Systems (CBCS): The CBCS provides choice for students to select from the prescribed courses (core, elective or soft skill courses).
 - A course is essentially a constituent of a *Programme*. The course should define learning objectives and learning outcome. A course may be designed to comprise lectures / tutorials / laboratory work/ field work/ outreach activities/ project work/ seminars / term papers/ assignments/presentations / self-study etc. or a combination of some of these.
 - A unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the Number of hours of Instructions required per week. One credit is equivalent to minimum of 30 to 40 hours of learning.
 - 5) Credit point It is the product of grade points & number of credits for a course.
 - 6) Grade point It is numerical weight allotted in each letter grade on 10 point scale.
 - 7) Letter grade It is an index of performance of students in a said course. Grades are denoted by letters.



- 5. (i) The following shall be the examination leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Science in the Faculty of Science and Technology.
 - a. विज्ञान स्नातक B.Sc Part-I, (semester I and II examinations.)
 - b. विज्ञान स्नातक B.Sc. Part II, semester III and IV examinations); and
 - c. विज्ञान स्नातक B.Sc. Part III, semester V and VI examinations.)
 - (ii) The Duration of the program: The duration of undergraduate (U.G.) program (B.Sc.) in the Faculty of Science and Technology shall be of three Academic years consisting of six semesters.
- 6. Admission and Eligibility criteria: Subject to their compliance with the provisions of this direction and of other ordinance in force from time to time, an applicant for admission to semester I of CBCS, B.Sc. I, must have passed higher secondary (10+ 2) or an equivalent course recognized from M.S. Board/ CBSE/or recognized body.
 - 7. (I) The student passing H.S.C examination with Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics shall offer the following subjects at B.Sc. I examination.
- Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course: English and any one of the following languages Marathi, Hindi, and supplementary English.
- ii) Three core subjects from the following subjects available in the university- Physics, Chemistry, Electronics, Mathematics, Computer Science, Geology.
 - (II) The student passing H.S.S. Examination with Chemistry and Biology shall offer following subjects:
- i) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course: English and any one of the following languages :- Marathi, Hindi, and supplementary English.
- ii) Three core subjects from the following subjects available in the university: Botany, Zoology, Biochemistry, Environmental Science, Microbiology, Biotechnology, Industrial fish and fisheries and Geology.
 - (III) The students passing H.S.C. examination (M.C.V.C. stream) with technical trades shall be eligible for the admission to CBCS, semester pattern B.Sc. I course as follow:
 - i) Paramedical/Agricultural/Fisheries group: can take any allowed combination of three from the following subjects: Zoology, Botany, Microbiology. Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Environmental science, Industrial fish and fisheries, Chemistry, Geology.
 - ii) Engineering and technology, Computer Science group:- can take any allowed combination of three from the following:- Physics, Chemistry, Computer Science, Mathematics and Electronics, Geology
 - 8. Every examinee for the B.Sc. Part I (Semester I &II) Examinations shall be examined in:
 - a) AECC-English
 - b) AECC-Any one of the following languages: Marathi, Hindi, Supplementary English
 - c) Any one combination allowed/available at the concerned college or Institute as shown in Appendix E.

- 9. In the case of B.Sc. Part-II, (Sem. III & IV Examinations): The student shall have passed not less than one academic year previously the (B.Sc. Part-I, Sem. I & II Examinations) of the University or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto, and
- 10. In the case of the B.Sc. Final, (Sem. V & VI Examinations):- The student shall have passed not less than one Academic year previously the (B.Sc. Part-II) (Sem. III & IV) Examinations of the University or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto:

11. Norms of A.T.K.T:---

The admission to the program shall be subjected to ATKT rules as given below:

- a) A student shall be allowed to keep term for semester II irrespective of grades obtained in each course of semester I
- b) A student shall be allowed to keep term for semester III if he/she passes (grade E or above in each course) each of semester I & semester II Or He/ She passes two courses in each semester.
- c) A student shall be allowed to keep term for semester IV irrespective of grades obtained in each course of semester III & can appear for Semester IV examination.
- d) A student shall be allowed to keep term for semester V, if he / She passes semester I,II, III & IV. Or He / She has passed Semester I & Semester II and Pass in at least 1 courses each of Semester III & IV.
- e) A student shall be allowed to keep term for Sem VI irrespective of grades obtained in each course of Semester V.

There will be supplementary examination conducted for external evaluation (Semester end) by the university.

- 12. There shall be total six semester, in U.G. level B.Sc. program
- 13. Each semester shall comprise minimum 90 (Ninety) actual teaching days.
- 14. Every subject (Except languages and Mathematics) in each semester will comprises of -
- a) Two theory papers 50 marks each
- b) One internal assessment, based on two theory papers 10 marks each.
- c) One practical/Laboratory work- Total 30 marks
- 15. For Mathematics-
- a) Two theory papers- 60 marks each
- b) One internal assessment based on two theory papers for 15 marks each
- 16. In addition to above, Semester I & II will have
- a) One AECC English paper of 80 marks and 20 marks for internal assessment.
- b) One second language paper of 80 marks and 20 marks for internal assessment.
- 17. All theory papers shall be divided into four units.
- 18. The scope and limitations of the subjects of all semester opted by the students shall be indicated in the respective syllabi from time to time. The medium of instruction and examination shall be English, except for the courses in languages.
- 19. The fees for the tuition, examination, Laboratory and other fees shall be as prescribed by the University from time to time.
- 20. The theory question paper will be as per CBCS examination pattern as decided by respective B.O.S.



- All theory examinations shall be conducted by Gondwana University Gadchiroli at the end of each Semester.
- 22. Practical examination for all odd semesters shall be conducted at the college level and all even semester, by Gondwana University, Gadchiroli.
- 23. Duration of practical examinations shall be 6 to 8 hrs, for one or two day, depending upon subject and number of students.
- 24. The number of papers, practicals, teaching hours, the maximum marks allotted and minimum marks which an examinee must obtain in order to pass the examination, all details are shown in Appendices A, B1 & B2 appended to this Direction.
- 25. The scheme of awarding marks for internal assessment with every detail shall be as per appendix C appended with this Direction.
- 26. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary of this Direction, no candidates shall be admitted to B.Sc. part I, (semester I and II), B.Sc. II- (Sem. III and IV) and B.Sc. final (semester V and VI) examinations under this Direction, if he/she has already passed the corresponding or an equivalent examination of any other statutory University.
- 27. As soon as possible after the examinations the Board of Examination shall publish a list of successful examinees at the B.Sc. Part-I, (Sem. I &II) B.Sc. Part-II, (Sem. III & IV) and B.Sc. Final (Sem. V & VI) Examinations. The result of all examinations shall be classified on the basis of semester Grade point Average 'SGPA' evaluated as specified in the adopted model CBCS (Appendix D).
- 28. The examinees who have secured pass grade in all subjects prescribed for all the examinations shall be eligible for the award of Degree of Bachelor of Science. The classification of division of examinees for the award of Degree of Bachelor of Science shall be on the basis of Cumulative Grade Point Average 'CGPA' evaluated by accounting SGPA of all semesters as demonstrated in the Appendix D.
- 29. Successful Examinees at the final examination shall be on payment of the prescribed fees, will be entitled for the award of the degree in the prescribed form signed by the Vice Chancellor
- Absorption scheme to switch over from yearly to semester pattern (From other University to Gondwana University)
- a) The candidates who have cleared first year annual pattern examination in the subject shall get admission to third semester directly by matchable scheme. However, candidates who are allowed to keep term will not be eligible for admission to third semester unless they clear all the papers and practicals of first year annual pattern examination.

 Admission to 5th semester, student should clear second year annual pattern examination in all subjects.

Evaluation of Internal Assessment

The internal assessment marks assigned to each theory paper as mentioned in Appendix-A and B1-B2 shall be awarded on the basis of following parameter. Each BOS shall have right to decide the distribution of marks for internal assessment but there should be separate evaluation for each theory paper. Internal assessment shall be done by University approved teacher in relevant subjects. Internal assessment shall be done by the respective college one month prior to the final exam of each semester. The marks shall be sent to the university immediately after the internal assessment is over.

Internal assessment parameters

- Class test/multiple choice question objective/open book test/unit test etc.
- Home assignments/case study/quizzes/group Discussion.
- Attendance
- Seminar or project etc.
- Industrial visit/field work/visit to research Institute.
- Active participation in routine class instructional deliveries i.e. case
- Overall conduct as a responsible student, skill in articulation, leadership qualities expressed in co-curricular activities etc.

Note:1. The concerned teacher shall have to keep the record of all the above activities till the passing out of that batch.

- 2. At the beginning of each semester, every teacher shall inform his/her students unambiguously the method he/she proposes to adopt a scheme of marking for the internal assessment.
- 3. Teacher shall announce the schedule of activity for Internal Assessment in advance in consultation with HOD/ Principal.

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): It is the measure of performance of work done in a semester. It is the ratio of total credit points earned by a student in various courses registered in a semester & the total course credits taken during that semester.

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): The CGPA is the ratio of total credit points earned by a student in various courses in all semester and the sum of total credits of all courses in all semester.

Types of Courses -

Courses in a Programme may be of three kinds: Core, Elective & Foundation.

1. Core course: This is the course which is to be studied compulsorily by a student as a core requirement of a Programme in a said discipline of study.

2. Elective Courses:

Elective course is a course which is to be chosen from a pool of paper, it may be

- · Supportive to the discipline of study.
- Providing an expanded scope.
- Enabling learner to get an exposure to some other discipline / domain
- Nurturing students' proficiency /skill.

An Elective may be generic elective, focusing on those courses, which add generic proficiency. An elective may be discipline centric or may be chosen from an unrelated discipline. It may be called *Open Elective*.

3. Foundation Course:

May be of two kinds: Compulsory Foundation (Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course) & Elective Foundation (Skill Enhancement Course). Compulsory foundation is those courses based upon contents that leads to knowledge enhancement. They are mandatory for all disciplines. Elective foundation courses are value-based & aimed at man-making education.

Whereas, the chairman, U.G.C. New Delhi has directed the Vice-Chancellor of the university to initiate steps for successful implementation of the choice based credit system(CBCS) from the Academic Session 2015-16 vide letter D.O.No.F-1-1/2015(CM) dated 8/01/2015;

AND

Whereas, the U.G.C. has formulated and issued guidelines on adoption of choice based credit system in all the universities;

AND

Whereas, the Vice-Chancellor has directed, on the basis of the resolution of the authorities of the university, to formulate and introduce choice based credit system at U.G. and P.G. level programme in all the faculties in the university;

AND

Whereas, the matter to introduce choice based credit system is required to be regulated by an ordinance to be made in this behalf;

Whereas, no Ordinance is in existence in the university for introducing choice based credit system in the faculty of Commerce and Management;

AND

Whereas, making of an Ordinance for introducing choice based credit system in the faculty of Commerce and Management is a time consuming process;

Whereas, the choice based credit system is to be introduced at the Bachelor of Commerce Degree level in the faculty of Commerce and Management from the Academic year 2017-18.

Now, therefore, I,Dr. N.V. Kalyankar, Vice-chancellor, Gondwana University, Gadchiroli in exercise of the powers vested in me under provision of section 12(8) of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 do hereby issue following Directions:-

- 1. This Direction shall be called "Examinations leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.) (Six semester Degree Course) based on Choice based credit system in the faculty of Commerce and Management, Direction, 2017."
- 2. This Direction shall come into force with effect from the Academic year 2017-18 for I st and II nd semester of the Bachelor degree course and onwards i.e. Bachelor of Commerce Degree.

TYPES OF COURSES

Types of Courses: - Courses in a Program may be of three kinds: Core, Elective 3. &Foundation.

1)Core course: This is the course which is to be studied compulsorily by a student as a core requirement of a Program in a said discipline of study.

2) Elective Courses:

Elective course is a course which is to be chosen from a pool of papers, it may be

- Supportive to the discipline of study.
- Providing an expanded scope.
- Enabling learner to get an exposure to some other discipline / domain
- Nurturing students' proficiency / skill.

An Elective may be generic elective, focusing on those courses, which add generic proficiency. An elective may be discipline centric (Discipline Specific Electives, DSE) or may be chosen from an unrelated discipline. It may be called Generic Elective/Open Elective.

3) Foundation Course:

May be of two kinds: Compulsory Foundation (Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course) Elective Foundation (Skill Enhancement Course). Compulsory foundation is those courses based upon a content that leads to knowledge enhancement. They are mandatory for all disciplines. Elective foundation courses are value-based & aimed at man-making education.

4)Salient features of Course:

(I) i)Each semester up to semester 4th, shall consists of 7 paperswhereas semester 5th and

6th shall consist of 6 papers each.

- ii) Total credits for B.Com. would be 136 whereas total credits for BBA would be 132.
- iii) Each regular student will have to appear for all the credits of each semester mentioned in the scheme.

(II)The duration of the B.Com. and BBA shall be of three academic years consisting of six semesters with the University examinations at the end of each semester namely:

i) B.Com. Part I

: Semester I & Semester II Examinations

ii) B.Com. Part II

: Semester III & Semester IV Examinations

iii) B.Com. Part III

: Semester V & Semester VI Examinations

EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION SCHEME

1)Evaluation Scheme

Assessment procedure incorporates a suitable evaluation system supported by model_ Credit Grade System involving letter grades as per the suggested guide lines by, UGC for undergraduate programs in the Faculty of Commerce and Management.

The evaluation of students in a course is a continuous process and is based on their performance in different methodological tests/examinations as mentioned below:

Theory Subject with or without Practical component:

It is broken into various components as mentioned below;

- i) Internal Assessment (IA)—It will be carrying 20%weightage and shall be monitored based on parameters like, assignments, class tests, seminars, project, oral examination etc. and that the break-up of weightage to these parameters are as specified in the syllabus of the given subject.
- ii) End Semester Examination (ESE)—This parameter shall carry weightage of 80% for theory subjects without practical component and the examination will be conducted by the Affiliating University at the end of the Semester.
- iii) Passing in Course: There will be a combined head of passing with 40% of marks combinedly in IA and ESE and separate passing with 40% marks in practical.

The **Table1** given below summarizes weightage in percent to the individual components of proposed Evaluation System to be adapted for the theory subjects with and without practical component of UG programs in the Faculty of Commerce and Management.

- 4). That an examinee who have passed in any subject/s shall, this option, be exempted from appearing in that subject at the subsequent examination.
- 5) The fees for the examination shall be as prescribed by the university from time to time and when ever any change is made in the fees prescribed for the examination that shall be notified through a notification for information of the examinees concerned.
- 6) The subjects of examination shall be as mentioned in CBCS structure mentioned under Appendices I,II,III,IV,V and VI appended to this direction.
- 7) The Scope of the subject shall be as indicated in the Syllabi.

Model Credit-Grade System

- 7.As per the guide lines suggested by UGC, all the central, state and deemed universities in India, it is now mandatory to adopt credit system inplace of conventional system comprising of marks and grades for all the under graduate programs. The central idea of the system is that a student has to earn prescribed minimum number of credits to fulfill there quirements of graduation. The credit system has to be design eduniformly together with a suitable continuous evaluation and a well-articulated system of grading.
- i) All evaluations of different components of a course specified in the course plani. e. scheme shall be done in marks for each student.
- ii) The marks of various components of Internal Assessment and university conducted examination i.e. ESE shall be added to get total marks secured for the given course. For example, out of a total of 100 marks fortheorysubjects.
- iii) These letter grades are as signed numerical equivalents called Grade Points, **GP** on a 07-point scale and are correlated with percentages core of the student in the given course as shown in the **Table 2** given below.
- iv) For the given course, the adopted criteria of percentage marks given below shall then be used for the computation of grades and grade points.
- v) F- grade stands for failure in that course examination. The course(s)in which a student has earned F-grade will be term edas back-logi. e. course(s)under ATKT.

Credit Points(CP)

Credit points stands for performance of student in a particular subject. They are product of total credits of a subject and grade point secured by the student in the given subject.

Semester Grade Point Average(SGPA)

It is indicative of performance of a student in the given semester. The Grade Point Average for a semester is obtained by adding he products of Actual Grade Points and relative weightages for different subjects as shown in the course scheme for respective semester and dividing the total by the total credit hours for that semester as illustrated below.

Where, C - No of Credits of individual subject.

G- Corresponding gradepoint obtained in the respective subject.

CumulativeGradePoint Average (CGPA)

The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)is indicative of the overall academic performance of a student in all the subjects registered up to and including the latest completed semester. It is the cumulative total of the products of actual grade point and its weightage upto last semester divided by total credits of all the semesters.

- (1) A student who PASSES in the each head of passing shall be granted exemption in that paper. But, if he passes in practical and fails in combined head of ESE+IA of a subject, shall reappear for the ESE of the given subject. However, his/her marks of the IA and P shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on passing of the end semester examination of the given subject.
- (2) A student who FAILS in the Practical /Project but PASSES in the ESE+IA of a subject shall submit and reappear for the Practical/Project for that subject. However, his/her marks of the ESE+IA shall be entitled for grade obtained by him/her on qualifying in the Practical/Project evaluation.
- (3) The marks for the IA or Practical /Project shall be forwarded by Principal/Head of the Institution to the Affiliate University as per the schedule.
- (4) If a student is permitted to repeat any semester/course, the new letter grade will replace the old letter grade in the computation of the SGPA and further that every student will have only one grade-sheet for every semester and the last semester grade-sheet to indicate CGPA based on the adapted criteria for the Award of the Degree.

- (6) The number of paper and maximum marks assigned to each paper and minimum marks an examinee must obtain in order to pass the given examination are as prescribed in there spective course and examination Schemes attached with Appendix A in this Direction.

Once this option is exercised, the option shall be bind in gon the examinee for that Semester examination only and it shall not be revoked under any circumstances.

An unsuccessful examinee, at any of the above examination shall have an option to carry his/her Internal Assessment and Practical marks for theory with or without having practical part to his/her successive attempt at the examination.


The examinee, however can forego his/her Internal Assessment marks for the subjects, in which case he/she shall be examined for a total of marks comprising the Internal Assessment & ESE or Internal Assessment, Practical and ESE together to for the min. passing marks of 40% a this/her successive attempts of the examination. Such an option may be availed by the examinee by indicating the same in his/her Application form for Examination and this option once exercised ,it shall be—Final and Binding \square on the concerned examinee.

- (8) The external(Private) Candidates are not allowed for this programme
- (9) The provisions of Ordinance to provide grace marks for passing in a particular head and regarding improvement of Division(Higher class) and Condonation of Deficiency of marks in a subject shall apply to each examination under this Direction.
- (10) Every student have right to challenge the evaluation, if he/she failed in such paper of any doubt in his/her scoring as per the provisions made in respective Direction by the Affiliating University.

The provision regarding Revaluation /Challenge to valuation for the given subject of a particular End Semester Examination shall be applicable as specified in there levant Direction.

- (11) The candidate may take all the examinations as per the provisions of ATKT Rules simultaneously but his result offinal Semester shall not be declared unless he is declared successful at all lower semester examinations.
- (12) If an examinee failed to pass the under graduate programme with in six successive years from the date of his/her first admission to particular programme, he/she shall be declared as—Not Fit for the Course (NFC) and he/she will not be allowed to appear further for any previous examination of the course. Anex-student for any Examination under this Direction shall be eligible for readmission to the subsequent Examination on payment offers hand any such other fees as may be prescribed on this behalf.
- (13) As soon as possible after the Semester End examination, the Board of Examination and evaluation shall publish a list of successful examinees at the

- 1. This Direction shall be called "Examinations leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Home Science (B.SC.) (Six semester Degree Course) based on Choice based credit system in the faculty of Science and Technology, Direction, 2017."
- 2. This Direction shall come into force with effect from the Academic year 2017-18 for Ist and IInd semester of the Bachelor degree course and onwards i.e. Bachelor of Home Science Degree.
- **3. (i)** The following shall be the examinations leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Home Science in the faculty of Science& Technology.
 - (1) (गृहविज्ञान) Bachelor of Home Science Part I, semester I and II examinations.
 - (2) (গৃহবিজ্ञান) Bachelor of Home Science Part II, semester III and IV examinations. and
 - (3) (गृहविज्ञान) Bachelor of Home Science Part III, semester V and VI examinations.
 - (ii) The Duration of the program: The duration of undergraduate (U.G.) program in the faculty of Science& TechnologyBachelor of Home Science (B.Sc. Home Sc.) shall be of three academic years consisting of six semesters.
 - a) Admission and Eligibility criteria: Subject to his compliance with the provisions of this direction and of other ordinances in force from time to time, an applicant for admission to semester I of Bachelor of Home Science, have passed XII standard examination of MS Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary education or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto under the following discipline Science/Home Science/Arts/commerce/MCVC.
- 4. (1) In the case of (Bachelor of Home SciencePart-II, Sem. III & IV)

- 6. There shall be total six semester, in U.G. level Bachelor of Home Science program. Each semester shall comprise 90 (Ninety) actual teaching days.
- 7. Home Science programeshall comprise of 5 core subjectsi.e- Food Science and Nutrition, Human Development, Textiles and Clothing, Resource Management and Home Science Extension, whereas allied subjects shall comprise of Basic and Applied Chemistry, Applied Physiology, Household, Biology, Health Science, Nutritional Biochemistry and Computer Basics and applications. There shall be no theory paper for the subjects related to Computer (Basic Computer / Application) & Skill base Course & Project.
- English is compulsory for 1stSem and 2ndSem only.
- All theory papers shall be divided into four units.
- 10. The scope and limitations of the subjects of all semester opted by the students shall be indicated in the respective syllabi. The medium of instructions and examinations shall be English,/ Marathi / Hindi except for the course in language (English)
- 11. The fees for the tuition, examinations, Laboratory and other fees shall be as prescribed by the University from time to time. The theory question paper will follow similar pattern for maximum subjects with inter unit choice and equal weightage to all questions. Duration of each theory paper shall be three hours. There will be five questions each of 8 marks. Fifth question will be based on entire syllabus. All questions are compulsory with internal choice. Questions may be subdivided into sub questions.

- **12.** All theory examinations shall be conducted by Gondwana University Gadchiroli at the end of each Semester.
- Practical examination for all semesters shall be conducted once in a year, at the end of 2nd.4th and 6th semester, by Gondwana University, Gadchiroli. At every odd semester i.e. 1st, 3rd and 5th semester there shall be internal assessment for the practicals completed, record of which should be put before the external examiner at the time of university practical examination.

Project: Every student is required to vary out project work (Sem-VI) on a related research topic of the subject / Course. It must be on original work. On the basis of this work student must submit the project report (typed & properly bound) at least 15 days prior to commencement of the final practical examination of Sem-VI.

- **14.** Duration of practical examinations shall be 3 hrs, for one or two day, depending upon subject and number of students
- **15.** Practical batch shall be of 16 students.
- **16.** Marks should be allotted according to the marking scheme.
- 17. The number of papers, practicals, teaching hours, the maximum marks allotted and minimum marks which an examinee must obtain in order to pass the examination, all details are shown in **Appendices A & B** appended to this Direction.
- **18.** The scheme of absorption and matching shall be as per **appendix** Cappended with this Direction.
- 19. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary of this direction no candidates shall be admitted to Bachelor of Home Science I, (semester I and II), Bachelor of Home Science II- (Sem-III and IV) and Bachelor of Home Science final (semester V and VI) examinations under this direction, if she has already passed the corresponding or an equivalent examination of any other statutory University.
- 20. As soon as possible after the examinations the Board of Examination and evaluation shall publish a list of successful examinees at the Bachelor of Home ScienceSem-I ⅈ Bachelor of Home ScienceSem-III & IV and Bachelor of Home ScienceSem-V & VI Examinations. The result of all examinations shall be classified on the basis of semester Grade point Average 'SGPA' evaluated as specified in the adopted model Credit-Grade system (Appendix D).
- 21. The examinees who have secured pass grade in all subjects prescribed for all the examinations shall be eligible for the award of Degree of Bachelor of Home Science. The classification of division of examinees for the award of Degree of Bachelor of Home Science shall be on the basis of Cumulative Grade Point Average 'CGPA' evaluated by accounting SGPA of V and VI semester as demonstrated in the Appendix D appended with this Direction.

22. Successful Examinees at the final examination, on payment of the prescribed fees, will be entitled for the award of the degree in the prescribed form signed by the Vice Chancellor.

Guidelines for Internal Assessment (IA), Theory Paper Pattern and Practicals

Each semester shall comprise of minimum 90 teaching days.
 For all Practical's the batch will be of 16 students.

2. To all Fractical State Dates will be of 10 states.

3. The Practical Examination will be conducted for even semester (Semester-II, IV and VI) the practical examination will be conducted by both External and Internal examiner.

The marks for Practical shall be allotted by Internal and External examiner together and marks of Internal Assessment to be given by Internal but the articles prepared or reports to be presented before the External examiner and marks to be finalized.

All theory and practical examinations are as per shown in the scheme.

I-Internal Assessment (IA):

1. The internal assessment shall be done by the College at least 15 days prior to the final examination of each semester. The Marks shall be sent to the University immediately after the Assessment in the prescribed format.

-Guidelines for Internal Assessment are appended herewith.

- a) The internal assessment marks assigned to each theory paper as mentioned in Appendix A shall be awarded on the basis of assignments like class test, attendance, project assignments, seminar, study tour, industrial visits, visit to educational institutions and research organizations, field work, group discussions or any other innovative practice / activity.
- b) There shall be one / two assignments (as described above) per Theory paper.
- c) There shall be no separate / extra allotment of work load to the teacher concerned. He/ She shall conduct the Internal assessment activity during the regular teaching days / periods as a part of regular teaching activity.
- d) The concerned teacher / department / college shall have to keep the record of all the above activities until six months after the declaration of the results of that semester.
- e) At the beginning of each semester, every teacher shall inform his / her students clearly the method he / she intend to adopt and the scheme of marking for internal assessment.

f) Teacher shall announce the schedule of activity for internal assessment in advance in consultation with HOD / Principal.

g) Final submission of internal marks to the university shall be before the commencement of the university theory examinations.

II-Theory Papers:

- All Theory papers shall be divided into four units.

 - 1. Four units in each paper
 - 2. One question on each unit (including sub questions)
 - 3. Fifth question on all units
 - 4. Maximum marks of each theory paper shall be as provided in Appendix A-I to A-VI of this Direction.

III. Practicals

- Practical exam shall be of 3 hours duration.
- The Practical Record/ Laboratory Manual of every student shall carry a certificate as shown below, duly signed by ii) the teacher-in-charge and the Head of the Department.
- If the student fails to submit her certified Practical Record/ Laboratory manual duly signed by the Teacher-iniii) Charge and the Head of the Department, she shall not be allowed to appear for the Practical Examination and no Marks shall be allotted to the student.

- While switching over to CBCS pattern, the failure students of CBC will be given total five (three plus two) chances to clear each
- b) After availing five chances for clearing the examination as per Semester, no examination would be held for Semester Pattern candidates.
- The candidates who have cleared first Semester ad IInd Semester from CBS pattern examination shall get admission to third semester directly. However, candidates who are allowed to keep term will not be eligible for admission to third semester unless they clear all the papers and practicals.
- The candidates who have cleared second Semester & III Semester (CBS) examination in the subject shall get admission to fifth semester directly. However, candidates who are allowed to keep term will not be eligible for admission to fifth semester unless they clear all the papers and practicals of IIIrd& IV Semester (CBS).
- e) For other statutory university candidates with similar yearly pattern programme, shall be applicable.
- The guidelines of awarding internal marks / practical marks/ theory marks/ mark list (if any and if required) shall be as per guideline given in the Appendix-B.
- g) For other statutory university candidate with semester pattern B.Sc. (Home Science) programme- the candidate shall be admitted to the next higher semester provided that candidate shall have cleared previous semester and Gondwana University committee constituted from time to time for the purpose shall be scrutinised and clear the case on the basis of subject and syllabus contents of her previous semester examination of the other statutory university.
- Those student who fail to clear the examination within the available chances (three + two) would be bound by this absorption/matching scheme and would be required to take fresh admission in the CBCS semester pattern course.

Guidelines

- 1. Students unable to clear Semester (CBS) pattern in five chances in Sem I, III and V can take admission in corresponding semester pattern
- As per the requirement and if necessary, while switching over from CBS Pattern to CBCS semester pattern course, the university shall
- issue semester pattern course mark list in proportion of marks obtained in the CBS Pattern.

 As soon as the candidate enters in the CBS semester pattern course from the CBS Pattern as per the given absorption / matching scheme and successfully complete the semester pattern course, the university shall award revised mark list as per the semester pattern course for
- In case of any difference in minimum passing marks in the CBS Pattern and in the CBS semester pattern course, the university shall convert marks proportionately for issuance of mark list in the semester pattern course.
- During switching over from CBS Pattern to CBCS pattern, the candidate shall be awarded proportionate marks by the university.

Appendix: D

1. Credit, Grade, SGPA & CGPA

B.Sc. Home Sceience Program shall consist of six semesters, wherein the student has to complete certain number of credits. Each Subject (Paper, Practicals, Project and Seminar) has some fixed number of credits. The types of subject subheads are: Core, Core Practical, Discipline Specific Elective, Discipline Specific Elective Practical's, Skill Enhancement course, Ability Enhancement Course and Elective

It is a unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (lecture or tutorial) or two hours of practical work / field work per week. There will be 1 credit for 16-20 hours for Theory papers and Practical to be spent by the student per course in one semester.

Depending on the marks scored in a subject, student is given a Grade. Each grade has got certain grade points as follows:

A student obtaining Grades F and Ab shall be considered failed and will be required to reappear for the examination.

b) Computation of SGPA and CGPA

Following is the procedure to compute the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

i. The SGPA is the ratio of sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student, i.e.

SGPA (Si) = Σ (Ci x Gi) / Σ Ci

Where Ci is the number of credits of the ith course and Gi is the grade point scored by the student in the ith course. The CGPA is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a program, i.e.

- 1. This Direction shall be called "Examinations leading to the Degree of Master of Arts in Marathi with Choice Based Credit System in Semester Pattern in the Faculty of Arts, Direction, 2016.."

- 3. The course shall be of the duration of two academic years spread over four semesters and shall have University examinations at the end of each semester.

- a) A student failed to score minimum 40% marks in each head of passing shall be given F grade.
- b) A student who passes the internal tests but fails in Semester End Examination of a course shall be given F grade.
- c.)Student with F grade in a course would be granted credit for the course but not the grade for that course.
- d) Grade points earned in each paper shall be calculated as Grade points obtained (vide Table 1 above) x Credits for the paper.

Definitions:

- I) 'Credit' means the unit by which the course work is measured. In this Direction one credit means one hour of teaching work or two hours of practical work per week for 15 weeks in a Semester.
- II) 'Grade letter' is an index to indicate the performance of a student in particular course (paper). It is the transformation of actual marks secured by a student in a course / paper. Grade letters are O,A,B,C,D,E,F.

- VII) 'A.T.K.T.' refers to allowed to keep term in the next higher semester.
- 14. The computation of Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade point Average (CGPA) of an examinee shall be as given below:

- 15. Provisions of the Ordinance relating to the award of grace marks for passing an examination securing higher Grade, distinction in subjects as updated from time to time shall apply to the examination under this Direction.
- 16. The names of the successful examinee passing the examination as a whole in the minimum prescribed period and obtaining prescribed number of places securing the grades as per adopted credit grade system shall be arranged in order of merit as provided in ordinance relating to examinations in General.
- 17. No candidate shall be admitted to an examination under this direction, if he/she has already passed the same examination of this university or of any other university.
- 18. An examinee who does not pass or who fails to present himself for the examination shall be eligible for readmission to the same examination on payment of a fresh fee and such other fees and may be prescribed.
- 19. An unsuccessful examinee at any of the above examination shall carry college internal assessment Marks of the theory to his/her college assessment marks in the subject or subjects in which he/she shall be examined for total marks comprising of theory and internal assessment together at his / her successive attempts.
- 20. The candidate may take all the examinations as per the provision for A.T.K.T. simultaneously but his result of final semester shall not be declaired unless he is declared successful at lower semester examinations.
