PLANT MORPHOLOGY



Botanical Name : - *Uraria picta* (Jacq.) Desv. ex DC. Prodr.

Family : - Fabaceae

Local Name : - Pitwan

Morphology : -

Suffruticose under-shrubs, 1–1.5 m tall; stems stout, downy with hooked hairs. Leaves imparipinnate, 15–30 cm long; stipules triangular, acuminate. Leaflets sub-coriaceous, rounded at base, acute, green blotched with white and glabrous above, minutely pubescent beneath. Lower leaves often 1–trifoliolate; leaflets sub-orbicular or oblong. Inflorescence a long terminal densely many-flowered raceme. Flowers pink, bluish or reddish. Pods glabrous, 4–6-jointed; joints smooth. Seeds ovate. 1.5–2 mm long, light brown to greyish white.

Flowering & Fruiting: - September to October.

Uses : - Root is locally used against snake bite. The plant decoction is used for bleeding piles, cough etc.
